Charlestown May 30<sup>th</sup> 1781.

The Enclosed is a List of the Names of the Persons arrested and confined under the extraordinary Powers vested in his Board by an Act of the General Assembly passed last Session. John Hammond Cromwell, William Graves, William Graves Junr. Michael Birky, Joshua Doney, and others had for some Time past been suspected of being traitors for, and clandestinely trading with the enemy; and there were many considering fictitious causes to induce a Belief that they had been guilty of such perfidious Practices, but they were not deemed sufficient by the Grand Inquest for the Western Shore to find Proofs against them. The others were arrested as of being Persons whose general conduct and malignant Influence tended to spread Disaffection among the Subjects of the State and whose going at large might be therefore prejudicial to the government, most of the last Class have been released on giving good Security of good Behaviour. John Hammond Cromwell and his accomplices are still confined under Guard in this City. Warrants also issued against Benjamin Sheekley, Capt. Beach Edward Leonard and Francis but they are not yet even apprehended. George Mann is now confined in Baltimore Goal under the Resolution of the general Assembly.

General Assembly

In Virtue of the Power vested in us by the enclosed Resolutions we have appointed you Special Agent to procure Clothing for the Troops of this State, to be marched to the Southern Army, and as this is a Business of great Importance to this, as well to the United States, we earnestly recommend to your immediate Attention, the location where you will observe that the general Assembly have given Directions for a Quantity of fine and superfine Cloth to be immediately manufactured, in consequence of which we have issued our Orders to the Commissioners to have the same manufactured in equal Proportion immediately. This Cloth shall be delivered by the first of September you will therefore enter into Contracts for the Clothing immediately by exchanging the Cloth for such Articles as are most convenient wanting agreeably to the Tenor of our Contract or by finding the Cloth may be most advantageous to the State, the offer to begin first to take the Property of making your Machines in the United States
