 think of purchasing his Goods, and therefore leave them to you
 556. to do with as you may think proper. Mr. Beale Turner says
 that none of the Goods have been removed from Port Tobacco.
 The Assembly are making every exertion to establish the Credit
 and Validity of the Certificate, and of the paper Money of
 this State so that for the future we hope there will be
 no real Foundation for suspecting that they will not be
 perfectly discharged.
