Sir. We think it necessary the Pawn collected in the several towns on the western Shore should be turned over to the proper continental Officer at such Posts assigned by the Commander in chief for depositing it as you may think most convenient attending to the respective Quantities directed to be lodged at ~~each~~ Post in this Shore, Our Order to the Commissary of Md's County directing him to procure and forward one hundred Head of cattle to George Town for the use of the militia there appointed there was not countermanded, owing to Hury and the Multiplicity of Business always before this Board, we would have them turned over to the continental Officer there as soon as possible.

Sir, Genl. Smallwood has requested us to furnish the following Articles for the third Maryland Regiment, to wit, Four Horsemen's Tents, forty common Tents, a Box of pocket and amputating Instruments Drums Pipes Drumheads and Cord, the Horsemen's Tents to be made larger than those received. Nothing concerns the regiment but the want of Horses and waggons and the above articles, and we desire you will do every thing in your power to obtain and forward them immediately. If you can't get the amputating Instruments immediately don't delay sending the other articles of that account.
