Sir, Your Letter of the 25th July, we have received, it is necessary that the Men draughted ~~into~~ your County under the Acts of the two last Sessions, should be immediately marched to this City, where they will instantly upon their Arrival be supplied with every Article of Clothing they are entitled to by Law; you must be sensible it is not only
