As it is not our Desire that any of the people of the State should be oppressed when it can be avoided, we desire you would enquire into the above Circumstances and if you find the representation to be true, and that particular Hardship will result from the Detention of the Horse that you would restore him to the young man Mr. Robert Bowie.
