to your Assistance and have enclosed Commissions for Troop
all the publick Stores must be immediately moved out of Town
to Places of Security or in the Country, and the Inhabitants of
the Town must move out all their Goods and valuable Property.
The Marquis with his Army is moving this way. The Extract
