If you cannot procure the whole of the cattle by Purchase, and should meet with any Resistance or Difficulties in collecting them by Seizure, you may employ Persons to assist you, and call on the Lieutenant of your County whom we have directed to order out as many of the Light Horse Militia to aid you in the Execution of this Order, as will be necessary.

Circular Letters are dispatched to the respective Commissaries, urging them to use every Exertion in their Power to procure and forward the Supplies, agreeably to our former Orders. As they will probably be wanted before they can be collected, without the most strenuous Exertions, we beg leave to request every Aid in your Power, that this Business may not be a Moment retarded. To give the more Energy to the Exertions of the Commissaries, and to satisfy and quiet the Apprehensions of the Inhabitants, each Commissary is furnished with a Sum of Money to enable him to pay in Part for the cattle President of the Special Council.

It will be absolutely necessary to collect immediately, at Georgetown a quantity of Forage, sufficient for 3000 Horses and Oxen, on their Way to Virginia with Artillery and Heavy Baggage. To enable you to procure the Forage, we have sent you 150L which you are to lay out as Specie.
