64. We have advised with a Mr. Hartm. res-  
-pecting Linc's property, and you will see by his letter  
which is enclosed that it is his opinion the State has  
an undoubted right to execute and sell it, he says  
it was bound immediately upon the issuing of the  
Sci. fa., that the Judgment first obtained by Hamilton  
was an interlocutory one & of consequence did  
not bind the property, that the State cannot have  
the right to the property tied until a sale is

made
