Sir,

Agreeably to the notice given in March last
to persons appearing by the Intendants and Auditors
books to be indebted to the State, we mean without any
unnecessary delay to furnish the Attorney General with
a list of amounts on which to commence suits - but
many of the charges being contested, and some of them
having been already shown to be entirely erroneous, we
are inclined to use great caution in this business. Several
of the persons charged with unsettled balances have in
their answers referred to transactions and circumstances
with which you are probably better acquainted than any
other person, and your recollection would therefore assist
us much in determining the degree of credit due to
their allegations. You will therefore oblige us by
attending the board as soon as you conveniently can,
and assisting at an examination of these amounts, and
we further request that you would bring with you
all the documents in your possession relating to
confiscated property unbonded for, as we have taken
- up some steps to take in that business.
