and account, presented to this Board by Samuel Strett of
Agent for Mich^{rs} Van Staghorst, respecting the loan ne-
gotiated with them by the late W. Ridley. Although
the Resolutions of the Legislature on that Subject may seem
to authorize us to continue the payment of Interest, we
think that the fact lately instituted in this case has so
far changed the nature of the business as to render
it improper for us to make any further payments
while the Assembly is present to take explicit order
in it, and we have accordingly declined giving an
order on the Treasury unless it should be so directed
