 employ one, and make such agreement with him as
 the nature of the business, and the services expected from
 him require. as the Board have been informed that it
 will be necessary to have an Attorney independent of the
 Counsel to be employed in the business.

We think proper to observe that it is not the
 Opinion of the Board that you should attend to this
 business without an adequate compensation for your
 troubles, we shall in due time procure some eminent
 Counsel to cooperate with you in the Management
 of this Cause. We beg to have your answer immediately
 as the nature of this business requires immediate order.

The Board are informed that the services of
 W. Math. Dorratt is very material in the business, and
 of consequence to the interests of the State. We therefore
 wish you to take care that he be not removed from the
 by rule of Court or otherwise, so that the State in case
 of his death may not lose the benefit of it. —
