176. We enclose you the copy of a letter from Lord Chase Esq. on the subject of the suit in the Court of Chancery of Great Britain for the recovery of the Bank Stock. The application contained in which, we have deferred considering until we are satisfied by you and the Gentlemen joined with you in certain authorities relative to this Bank Stock, that the Object of your appointment cannot be effected without which declaration on your part, it is thought by some of the Board improper for us to re-assume the direction of this business - Mr Chase states that by the Attorney Generals claiming for the Crown every idea of a compromise must be at an end, and that therefore your powers have ceased, and that we should act under the authorities originally conferred on this Board - but as it seems doubtful whether we ought to determine the Object of your appointment impracticable without such an acknowledgment from your selves, we write to you Sir with the hope of being furnished as soon as your convenience will permit with your sentiments on this subject - We shall in the mean time write to Mr Johnson Esq. Sir Inwood & the other Messrs - We are Sir
