We understand that a W Vachel Stevens is now in Custody of the Sheriff of Ann Arundel County, and is generally supposed to entertain the design of clearing himself of his debts by virtue of the Act of Insolvency - the Benefit of which he cannot receive as he appears to owe more than £200 Sterling - To prevent therefore the States being defrauded we request you to, make known without delay the claim on your Books against Mr Stevens to the Sheriff and to Justices of the Peace as you can make it convenient to see, and that after procuring information of the day appointed for the meeting of the Justices to discharge Mr Stevens if any appointment has been made, that you attend the said meeting for the purpose of making a more formal exhibition of the said claim.
