We agree fully with you in opinion, that every precau-
-tion ought to be used to prevent the success of any
future attempt on the Treasury, and request that
183 you will have the repository secured in the manner
you propose as speedily as possible in the mean
time and until the work is completed, we think
a sufficient Guard ought to be kept every night

Sir,

We have taken into consideration your suggestion
respecting the terms on which you think it advisable to
sell the Confiscated property, and we agree with you
184 that as the Certificates for which this property was by
the Act directed to be sold may probably be out of circu-
-lation before the time of payment arrives, it is
proper to dispose of it for specie which we accordingly
-ingly request you to do, taking bond bearing interest
from the date and payable in three annual pay-
-ments and taking care to have a sufficient quantity
-ity of real property bound until the whole is
paid
