25. Sir, We have examined the certificates and other vouchers of Mary Jones, widow and Administratrix of William Miller deceased, and we are of opinion that he was entitled to an allowance as an Invalid Soldier from the time of his discharge - It has been customary with many of the Orphans Courts of this State to allow pay only from the time of the application to them, and we believe it to have been the practice of this Court - Mess^{rs} Worthington & Duym whose names appear to a certificate herein enclosed were Justices of the Orphans Court at the time of Miller's application to the Court.
