

In Council June 12th 1792

Gentlemen,

The enclosed letter will explain the objections made by the Commissioners to settle the accounts of the Individual States with the Continent, to our charge for building Barracks in Frederick Town. The Commissioners for the sale of confiscated property recollect nothing of the circumstances, nor does the Attorney General - as you were on the spot at the time the transactions

31. took place and in all probability fully acquainted with them; we shall be obliged to you to forward to us a Certificate so far as your knowledge extends respecting the Ground on which the Barracks stood, and whether the sale of the said Barracks was not prevented by the Land on which they were built being owned by Mr Pulany or some other person - we also beg the favor of you to inform us who is now in possession and under whom they occupy the same.
