In Council September 5th 1793

Sir,

Your letter of yesterday's date re-
specting the escape and the supposed designs of
88. General Galbaud, has just been received by this
Board in the absence of Governor Lee, who went
on Tuesday last to Baltimore, and is still either
there or in its neighbourhood.

We would advise you Sir, to make
him an immediate communication on this
subject; as while he is so near the seat of
Government, we should not think it proper
to take any measures without his assistance;
but you may be assured that when the
matter comes properly under our consideration,
we shall cheerfully take all practicable
measures to ensure the peace and safety
