Sir

In the execution of the Act for regulating and disciplining
the Militia of this State the Board have found themselves encountered
by difficulties which do not appear to have been foreseen by the Legislature
and which without other means of information than are now in their possession
it will be impracticable to surmount.

The Act directs an enumeration of the free male Inhabitants of
every County between eighteen and forty five years of age; the returns of which
have been generally received but as convenience requires that the respective
Regiments, Battalions and companies to be formed should, as to the residence
