Sir

Under the authority of the President of the United States, and at his particular request that I should appoint a Quarter Master and commissary of Military Stores to the Detachment of Militia of this State under marching orders. I have thought proper to appoint you to that office limiting the Compensation to the pay and Emoluments of a Major unless upon enquiry his double employment should justly and reasonably entitle you to more.

By letters which I have received from several of your friends I conclude you will accept this appointment, therefore I have to desire that you will immediately repair to Baltimore Town for the purpose of receiving the Military Stores ordered to that place by the Executive of the United States, and for receiving the orders of Brigadier General Smith who has the Command of the Maryland Troops on the Expedition to the Westward.
