

Hagers Town September 21st 1794.

Sir

You are requested to take the command of the Troops in this Town, destined for the Expedition against the Insurgents of Pennsylvania, and to Guard the Prisoners lately committed to Gaol, and do your usual duty in this Town, until you shall receive peremptory orders from your the Executive of the United States to march with the Detachment to Cumberland.

Give this order under an impression, that it is an Object of importance to the Government of the United States, that the Spirit of Rebellion which has lately manifested itself in the Conduct of the Prisoners should be speedily checked. You are also to take under your Command the Volunteers and Drafts from the several Regiments of this County.

Having reason to believe that the Spirit of disaffection and resistance to the laws which had unfortunately made its way into Washington County is now so far checked and subdued as to require no further controul than that which the Friends to Government within the County will be able to oppose to it, I have given orders for the return of all the Volunteers now in this place under my Requisition of the 13th Instant, and propose to return to Frederick Town myself early to morrow; previous to which I have thought it necessary to the peace and security of this
