

In Council October 5<sup>th</sup> 1794

Sir

We have this day written to Colonel Hollingsworth Communicating to him the following Arrangement relative to the two Regiments in Cecil County which we wish to be immediately adopted and the draughts sent on to join General Smith with all possible dispatch. The Quota of this State not being nearly Complete, and great Complaints are every day making on that account.

Colonel Hollingsworth to begin at the upper part of the County on the Susquehanna adjoining Pennsylvania and Complete his Regiment taking in the whole County in Breadth, and you are to begin at the lower part and Complete yours. The surplus if any directions will be given in future respecting them. you will please to forward Recommendations for the officers wanting to Complete your Regiment.
