in the mean time we request that you will make enquiry whether Powder
can be obtained for the reception of the Powder or a part of it and if so
what terms; and as the Resolution is express as to repairing the arms
for the arms and accoutrements only, we wish you to inform us as far
as possible for what sum they can be made. Whatever may be necessary
for that purpose we are authorised to give orders for, but although it
might be advantageous to the State to erect a new building for the
purpose of securing the arms, we do not conceive it within the limits of our
power to contract for it.
