- 67 Muskets Tusces &c in extreme bad condition
- 51 Rusty Gun Barrels
- 7 Horsemen's Pistols wanting repair
- 61 Bayonets naked, consisting of British, Dutch &c
- 94 Round shot
- 1 Box containing 34 rounds of fixed Grape shot of 3 H^{rs} each
- 1 Do 20 do 1/2 H^{rs} do
- 1 Do 14 do fixed with 3 H^{rs} round shot
- 1 Do 12 do 3 H^{rs} do
- 3 Boxes each half filled with musket cartridges, partly armed and partly blank.
- 3 Cartridge Formers for Field pieces
- 5 Reams of Cartridge Paper and all other Paper
- 7 Pair of Hooks for carrying Shells
