The letter which we had to communicate respecting the Bank Stock has been already forwarded to the joint committee on that subject. It consisted only of a letter from Mr Chase and our reply to it.

We found it necessary during a short period when Mr Pinkney our Clerk was absent on account of his health to employ Mr King, and an order was drawn in his favour for thirty three pounds six shillings and eight pence.

Mr Pinkney had engaged a Gentleman to attend to the business in his absence with our approbation but he was not sufficiently at leisure to give the necessary time and attention to it.
