Sir

As you are appointed by the Executive of Maryland the agent to receive M^r DeLancey as soon as the circumstances which you may find necessary are known

The first intent of the act passed by Congress on the 17th of March 1793 concerning a detention of the British in a warlike time to enable the State to have the aid of the British to be present by its agent to receive the same

As the name of M^r DeLancey deserves some particular consideration I request that your inquiries will not suffer him to be released from his present confinement before notice shall be given to the Executive of Maryland and to the present Congress
