

In Council Annapolis February 7. 1799

Sir

By a Resolution of the Legislature passed at November Session 1793 William Campbell and Robert Denny Esquires were authorised to adjust the Claims between the State and William A. Washington. It was directed by the Resolution that Mr. Washington should give a Bond to the State to abide by the award of those Gentlemen. It has been represented to us that the Bond was given and put into your Possession. The award of the arbitrators mentions that they were satisfied of the existence of the Bond by a Certificate from you when Governor of the State.

We presume that the Bond is still in your Hands and will therefore thank you to forward it to us by the Post next succeeding the receipt of this.
