Council Chamber Annapolis July 29/1801

Sir,

The Executive have received a Petition signed by a number of persons praying that a Proclamation might issue for the apprehension of Stephen Joy charged with having killed Robert Young.

As Stephen Joy now resides in Virginia, it must appear plain, that the Proclamation of the Executive could have no effect, and that the only mode of bringing him to Justice would be, by an application to the Governor of Virginia, under and by virtue of the laws and Constitution of the United States. If he has been presented in your Court, a copy of the
