Resolution giving authority to the Governor and Council.

Sir

Information has been given to this Executive of this State, that a certain  
Samuel Banks otherwise called Samuel Black, did steal from one Samuel  
Black in the Month of March 1802, at Talbot County several Bank Notes,  
and that the said Banks or Black has fled from justice and is now in the  
Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, We have thought proper in the name of the  
Executive Authority of the State of Maryland to demand that your Excellency  
cause the said Banks or Black to be arrested and secured.

We have inclosed an affidavit on this subject for the satisfaction of  
your Excellency, and have to request that you will be obliging enough to give  
information to this Executive when the said Banks or Black shall be secured  
so that an agent may be appointed to receive him and bring him within the  
jurisdiction of this State for trial.
