We have the satisfaction of communicating to the General Assembly, that we have received information from the Agent, of the sale of the Stock in the British Funds. It appears, that the Bank Stock sold at 176 1/2 per Cent. The Navy 5 per Cent at 99 1/2 The 5 per Cent of 1797 at par.

We are also happy in having it in our power to state, that the whole expense of the negotiation amounts only to the sum of three pounds and six pence Sterling.

As soon as information shall be received that the investment of the proceeds has been completed, it shall be communicated by the Executive.
