In Council February 24 1806

Sir,

The Executive Authority of the State of New York having demanded as a Fugitive from Justice, a certain John Banks who it is said, is now confined in the Jail of Baltimore, which said Banks has been indicted in the City of New York for the Murder of his wife, as appears by an authenticated copy of said Indictment now in the possession of the Executive. We have therefore to request, that you will cause the said John Banks to be delivered to Thomas Barclay the person authorized to receive him by the Governor of New York: provided an affidavit be first made before you proving satisfactorily the said Banks to be the same person mentioned in the aforesaid Indictment and provided also, that he does not stand charged with an offence against the laws of this State for which he must first be tried: Should the said Banks be delivered, you will be pleased to forward to the Executive the affidavit identifying his person.
