Your letter to the adjutant General of the twenty seventh ultimo came to the hands of the Executive on this day. We regret that any circumstance should have occurred under any Administration to induce an old Revolutionary Officer to conceive the opinion of quitting the service, and as we feel the impression that there was no design to offend, but that the irregularity proceeded from inattention to the correct Military routine and predicated probably on the principles of Despatch. We confidently hope as your intention to resign has not yet been executed, that the present Crisis which has put in requisition the Military Talents of our Revolutionary Officers, will induce you to retain the office which the Government have confided to you from well placed confidence in your moral & merit.
