The State of Maryland being about to purchase of the General Government four thousand Stand of Arms of Whitney's Manufacture said to be in the Armoury of the United States in Philadelphia in the care of Captain Gallender Irvine Superintendent of Military Stores, the Governor and Council have taken the liberty to ask you to visit the Armoury and inform them as early as possible, whether it contains four thousand Stand of Arms of Whitney's Manufacture of a good quality. We feel a confidence in your attention and Judgment in this Business from the pleasing recollection of your having been an Officer in the Maryland Line, during our glorious Revolution.
