Gentlemen

We have taken your Report relative to the Situation of the Arsenal at Frederick Town into consideration. In conformity with the power vested in the Executive upon that subject we have deemed it most adviseable to request you to inform us what will be the probable expence of causing one wing of the Arsenal or so much thereof as may be necessary for the preservation and safe keeping of ten thousand Stand of Arms to be repaired in a strong and a faithful manner. The Executive intend to have the arms put up in Boxes containing about twenty five Stand each which when sent on to the Arsenal, are to be so disposed of and distributed in the different apartments provided for that purpose, that as little difficulty as the nature of the case will admit of may be experienced in their examination or removal. They also wish you to inform them what would be the probable expence of making such additional Repairs as would be necessary to prevent the remainder of the Arsenal from sustaining further decay or injury. They deem it unnecessary to observe to you that it is desirable to receive this information as soon as possible, in order that the necessary work may be commenced at an early period.
