

In Council Annapolis September 9 1811

Sir

The State of Maryland purchase of the United States twelve hundred
Muskets with Bayonets fifty brace of Horsesmen Pistols, and one hundred
Horsemen Swords. We expect these Arms to be of the same quality of those
received last year and to be furnished at the same Prices. Viz Muskets at
ten Dollars. Pistols as usual perhaps and Swords at seven Dollars and seven
pence. I must request the favor of you to forward as soon as your conveni-
ence will permit an order for their delivery and on its receipt the amount
of purchase Money shall be deposited in the Farmers Bank at Annapolis to
the credit of Thomas T. Luther Esquire Treasurer of the United States.

In Council Annapolis October 1811

Information having been received by the Executive of this State that a
certain Negro Slave named ^{John} ~~John~~ ^{Samuel} ~~Samuel~~ a free Negro who
was manacled and conveyed in a cage across the water at Annapolis from
eighteen hundred and nine of Illinois and had sentence of death passed on
him by the Court as mentioned in the fact of Philadelphia. We therefore in the
name of the Executive and Council of the State of Maryland demand of your Excellency
in the name of the State of Maryland that you will send to the Executive of the State of Mary-
land to receive the said Negro Slave named ^{John} ~~John~~ ^{Samuel} ~~Samuel~~ and deliver him up to Mr
Joseph Lewis who is appointed Agent of the Executive Authority of the State of Mary-
land to receive the said Negro Slave and to be manacled and conveyed to the State of Mary-
land. In this case for your information we have enclosed an authenti-
cated copy of his manacled conviction and sentence on which this application
