

In Council Annapolis January 28 1812

Information has been received by the Executive of this State, that a certain Jesse Homer otherwise called Jesse Jones, is now confined in the Jail at Richmond in the Government of Virginia, who has been indicted in the Court of Oyer and Terminer and Goal Delivery for Baltimore County in this State for passing on the fourth day of May last in the said County of Baltimore to John Patterson a Note of the Bank of Maryland knowing the same forged. We have therefore thought proper in the name of the Executive Authority of the State of Maryland, to demand of your Excellency, the said Jesse Homer alias Jesse Jones, as a fugitive from Justice, agreeably to the Act of Congress thereto relating, and that he be delivered to Mr. John Maidwell, whom we have appointed Agent to receive the said Jesse Homer alias Jesse Jones, and to remove him to this State. For your Excellency's satisfaction, we have enclosed an authenticated copy of the Indictment on which this application is grounded.
