We had the honour to address you some weeks since upon the subject of the defenceless situation of the Forts at this place and with a request to be informed, what aid was contemplated to be afforded to it by the General Government. We also deem it to be our duty to represent that other parts of the State are equally defenceless and unprotected and in many quarters incursions of the enemy and depredations to a considerable extent may be made. In this situation we must repeat our anxiety to be informed, what protection, on any emergency, may be expected from the General Government, what regular forces can be furnished, and in the event of the Militia of the State being called out for its defence, whether the expense will be defrayed by the United States
