

We have the honor to forward to you a copy of a Memorial from the inhabitants of Easton,
 has been laid before this Department. By the law of Maryland, in case of imminent and
 tened invasion, the Brigadier General or commanding officer of the place invaded,
 atered to be invaded has power to call out the Militia, and it was the opinion of this General
 that no step within its power to take could give to the inhabitants of that place further
 security. We thought it due however, to the Memorials to represent, their situation
 to the General Government, and would beg leave to observe, that the Town of Easton, being
 a place, in which many of the public Records are lodged, and in which too there is an
 armory of the State, it is of importance that every protection and security, which can
 be afforded to it, by either Government, should promptly be given. We have the honor

We had the honor to receive your letter of the thirtieth of March, covering Recom-
 missions of the commissioned and Staff Officers of the twenty first Regiment, which
 have had due consideration.

It appears that one hundred and forty four Stand of Arms, have already been
 sent to Companies of the twenty first Regiment, and an order to furnish Captain
 Wicks Company with seventy two Stand of Arms was adopted some short time ago.
 At this time it would be impracticable to furnish from the Armory for
 more Arms. The Troops to be stationed at this place, by virtue of the late Regiments
 of the General Government must be supplied from this Armory, and unluck-
 unately very few of the Arms have yet been tried and the trials which have
 been made shew the necessity of getting more out of the Armory until they
 are proved. It is hoped therefore, that the Arms, with which your Regiment
 be supplied, when Captain Wicks gets his Arms will be sufficient for the time.
 Something more may be done, at short time hence if should be found necessary.
 We have determined to furnish you with two boxes of Matched Carbines, which will be
 forwarded in whatever manner you shall be pleased to direct. With Compliments
