Sir In Council Annapolis April 17 1813
We send by Waggon, two hundred Stand of Arms, as many Cast Iron Pieces, two thousand five hundred Cartridges, and eight hundred flints for the use of the Militia of Calvert County. Sir Eastern April the 18 1813
I have directed two hundred and fifty Stand of Arms and accoutrements to be forwarded to Somerset and deposited at the Lower Ferry in the care of Captain George D. Atkinson to be distributed equally between the two Regiments of Somerset. Your proportion of them to be distributed in such manner as you may think proper, taking care to secure the safe keeping and delivery of them when thereto required by the Executive.
