We had hoped that an answer from the officers of the general government, in a nation which we have had the honor to make to them, would have enabled us to have general assurances of future protection and security. To provide for the common defence was one of the important objects for which the federal constitution was formed. To protect each state against invasion is made the imperative duty of the national government, and for that purpose every necessary power is delegated to the National Authorities. The means of defence reserved to the State governments are very limited, and their powers in the conduct of a war, defined. If however, the General Government should fail to afford adequate security against the violence of the enemy, the law of self-preservation, which belongs to communities as well as to individuals, would demand that every effort, which it is in our power to make, should be made for the safety of the state. It seems necessarily to follow, as the defence of the Union and of the several parts of it are committed to the General Government, that all expenses incurred in affording protection by the Federal States, ought to be reimbursed by the United States. It would be proper, therefore, to authorize by law the appointment of officers to keep regular accounts with the proper heads of the departments to which the State may be subjected.

I would afford the Executive of Maryland much pleasure to accompany their answer to your Memorial with the arms you deem necessary for your defence; but the demands made on them from different parts of the State, have left me at their disposal. In the communication made by the Governor to the Legislature, he recommended an appropriation to be made, to procure the necessary munitions of war. If this measure should be adopted, it would give the Executive greater facilities to afford to the citizens of Dorchester County every means of defence in their power.
