In Council Annapolis June 23. 1813

Information has been received by the Executive of this State that a certain Edward
Hennings charged with having committed certain felonies has fled to the Commonwealth
of Pennsylvania and is now confined in Philadelphia Gaol. I have therefore thought it
advisable in the name of the Executive Authority of the State of Maryland to demand
of your Excellency, the said Edward Hennings, as a fugitive from Justice, and that he be
delivered to Mr. Thomas Ross one of the Constables of the City of Baltimore, who is ap-
pointed Agent of the Executive Authority of Maryland, to receive the said Edward
Hennings and remove him to this State. I enclose for your Excellency's perusal
authenticated Copies of two Indictments on which this application is grounded.

When I last wrote to you on the subject of Captain Thompson's Station in your Regi-
ment, I expected before this should have been in Baltimore, and would have asked of
you a reference to the Officers, whose opinions induce you to believe I was incorrect in
my decision. As far as my enquiries have gone, I am confirmed in my opinion, that the
rank of the Captain gives rank to the Company, and consequently gives Station to it; but
I have been averse to giving any positive decision in this case with a hope, that on reflection
such an arrangement would be made, as would make any order unnecessary. However for
the present I have thought proper to intimate to you that under my present impression
I am of opinion that Captain Thompson can be ordered to take his Station in the Regi-
ment only on the right thereof. It would give me much pleasure if I could make any
conciliatory proposition in this case, but I confess where such opposite sentiments
as I am informed exist, there is not much probability of it. Yet if you think it practicable,
