The Executive acted on your accounts this day and are of opinion that the pay allowed you as Paymaster of the twenty first Regiment amounting to fifty eight Dollars and ninety three cents and compensation for your travelling expenses incurred in going to Easton for Pay Rolls and so forth inasmuch as this service was part of your duty as Paymaster. The Board also have allowed you the sum of one hundred and ten dollars for your trouble in purchasing supplies and other services.

Council Chamber Annapolis Monday

I received yours of the ninth Instant giving information of the depredations of the Enemy in Saint Marys. It is to be regretted that the Militia turns out with so much reluctance, to resist the expected incursions of the Enemy. Although they have been much necessarily harassed during the Summer, by being called into service, to watch the movements of the Enemy, they ought not to relax their exertions to prevent their further encroachments. At this distance it is not practicable for me to give any explicit orders, except that there should be no more officers called into service, than the number of men immediately requires, and that the expenses by all practicable means should be kept within due bounds. And with respect to Cavalry I would again endeavour to impress the opinion that in the mode of Warfare hitherto carried on by the Enemy on their Waters, they can not be stopped and are the most efficient and expensive force that can be called into service, and therefore no more ought to be called out than what can be successfully employed.
