In Council Annapolis October 17 1814
We some time ago received a letter from Brigadier General Winckler
informing us that he had been authorized by the President to accept on
behalf of the United States, all the Militia then in service under the
authority of the State of Maryland, including Cavalry as well as Infantry
but as we do not know the exact period whence to date this acceptance, we
must request the favour of you to give us the necessary information, that we
may give directions to have the Pay Rolls and Militia Accounts arranged in
conformity thereto preparatory to their being presented for a final adjustment.
As connected with this subject we beg leave to call your attention to the tenth
of an act of Congress passed on the eighteenth of April last entitled an act
in addition to an act to provide for calling forth the Militia to execute the laws of the
Union, suppress insurrections, and to repel invasions, and to repeal the act in
force for those purposes. By this act it is provided "that there be raised
