Sir In Council Annapolis May 20 1816  
I have received information that a certain George Warrin alias John Pickett and  
a certain Hannah Bradford a free Negro and that he is now confined in the Gaol of  
Philadelphia I have in the name of the Executive authority of the State of Maryland  
to demand of your Excellency the said George Warrin alias John Pickett as a fugitive from  
Justice, agreeably to the Act of Congress relating thereto and that he be delivered to  
Thomas Ross who has been appointed Agent for the purpose of removing him to this  
State. For your Excellency's satisfaction I have enclosed you the Documents on which  
this application is grounded. I have the honor to be

Sir Council Chamber Annapolis July 24 1816  
Information has been received by this Executive that a certain John Brewer  
who was sentenced by the Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery for  
Baltimore County at March Term eighteen hundred and twelve to the  
Penitentiary House in Baltimore County for the term of three years for  
stealing sundry Bank Notes of the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Balti-  
more has escaped from the said Penitentiary and is now confined in the Gaol  
of Philadelphia. In consequence of this information I deem it advisable  
in the name of the Executive authority of the State of Maryland to demand  
of your Excellency the said John H. Brewer as a fugitive from Justice and that  
he be delivered to Mr. Thomas Ross who is appointed Agent of the Executive  
authority of the State of Maryland to receive the said John H. Brewer and  
to remove him to this State. I enclose for your Excellency's perusal a copy of the Warrant  
duly authenticated. I have the honor to be
