

Not more than four thousand five hundred dollars out of the sum that was  
provided by the legislature can be paid for the materials, and it is deemed  
necessary to point out very particularly the manner in which the execution of  
the improvements to be made, or to confine you too closely to particulars; but the  
following suggestions may be of service to show what would be most agreeable to  
the Governor and Council as to the outlines of the work. The Parade in front  
to be gravelled, and supported by a low Wall, not to show above the ground  
on the inside, from the Back Wall the slope to be smoothed gently to the  
existing wall and added or own in grass seeds. Trees to be planted at your di-

Sir  
The enclosure who have been furnished with a copy of a letter from the Cashier of  
the Western Bank dated the twenty sixth ultimo to you, on the subject of your  
Paper, has directed me to inform you, that it is their opinion that the Paper  
should be furnished agreeably to law: But as the process of printing off a  
Bank Note would require a stamp previously put on the Paper: it would  
perhaps be more advantageous to put a stamp in Ink (or print) upon the Notes  
after they are prepared for the signatures of the President and Cashier: an  
arrangement to facilitate the operations would be readily embraced.  
They however think it unnecessary to incur the heavy expenses of Stamps  
and of purchasing the Paper without an express understanding from the Bank  
that it will pay for the Notes afterwards. It would be desirable to the Governor  
and Council that you should write to the Cashier of that Bank immediately
