Dear Sir

I will do myself the pleasure  
to <sup>mail</sup> the Thursday ~~to~~ enclose to you a number of Pay Rolls  
for the Eastern Shore which I have arranged and  
numbered to suit the account. As they are  
the only receipts which the pay masters have  
show how they have disposed of the  
money which was advanced to them  
from time to time by the State for the  
purpose of paying them off. I will thank  
you not to mix them with the other Papers  
in file in your department. As Pay  
rolls are filed in every instance to support  
that part of the accounts which relate  
to the Western Shore it will be only necessary  
any I presume to send you those  
where the ~~Executive~~ <sup>Executive</sup> (do not pass them)  
for the full amount charged in order  
that you may see the grounds on which
