Annapolis July 29<sup>th</sup> 1819

Agreeably to your request I have had placed to your credit the one the one hundred and ten dollars the amount of the Resolution which passed in your favour at the last Session for Rations furnished certain British prisoners during the late war - I have mad out from the Records of this Department a Statement which will shew the amount due from you to the State. As all your claims against the State have been passed and settled it renders it necessary that your account should be closed by paying into the Treasury the balance due.
