

Annapolis July 22nd 1819

My Dear Sir

It appears by the Records of this
Department, that the Executive advanced to you
the 3rd of August eighteen hundred and
fifteen, three hundred Dollars for the purpose
of purchasing supplies for the Troop of Horse
under your command, and by an account of
charges which you left with me to be filed it
appears that you expended two hundred and thirty six
dollars and eighty four cents, leaving a balance
against you of sixty three dollars and 16 cts. I have
the slightest doubt but that you laid out the
whole sum for militia purposes, and that you
have not over the state a cent, or if you do, that
it has escaped your memory, or even the liberty
which I have taken on this occasion, and
I attribute it to the high regard which I have
for you. Present my respectful
compliments to Mrs. H and believe me
to remain as usual your friend and servant.
