

Council Chamber Amasp: July 24th 1814

My Dear Sir In August eighteen hundred
and fourteen, it appears by the Records of the
Department, that the Executive advanced to
you sixteen hundred dollars to purchase
supplies for your Regiment, then in actual service.
By the Books of the Treasury, it appears, that you
returned fourteen hundred dollars leaving an
advance of two hundred dollars in your hands
to be accounted for. as there is no doubt that
you expended the two hundred dollars in the
purchase of supplies, I will thank you to
forward to me as soon as your convenience will
permit, a statement shewing the manner in
which that sum was laid out, in order that
it may be forwarded to Washington to be filed
as a voucher; you will see by referring to the
account filed in Mr. Hayner's office, that I
have charged the United States with that sum.
