My Dear Sir

You will perceive by perusing  
the enclosed Letter that Mr Wagner is  
proceeding in the examination of the  
Maryland account and that there is a  
prospect of its being soon finished. The  
supply account ought to take but a  
short time in its examination as there  
is nothing to be examined except a few  
contractors accounts. The supplies were  
furnished on the best terms that the spur  
of the occasion would admit of, (and I  
should think the General Government  
would not dream of paying less than we  
did). I can see no object then of  
reducing them to rations
