

conclude to not to disclose any delinquency and well qualified
Officers, against whom there were no well grounded
complaints. It was understood that there was already a
Notary public at Williamsport, qualified for & respected
in his office, and whose official conduct was not complained of
and that as all the business of his office grew out of the transaction
of the bank, the appointment of a competitor to whom all
patronage and business of that institution were intended
to be transferred, would be equivalent to a removal of the first
from office, without offence on his part and without complaint
against him. But for this consideration, in compliance with
wishes of yourself and the directors would have afforded me a
personal gratification; and I think I may rely upon your
liberality and theirs to estimate justly, the motives by
which I have been governed.
